Our drop off hosts 32 families each Tuesday afternoon, **that's the largest Pre-Box distribution in the entire program** which covers large companies like Paychex, Xerox, and the University of Rochester. The Good Food Collective delivers fresh, local organic produce delivered right to Winona Woods. The summer share costs \$392.00 and includes 14 weekly deliveries of produce from June through September in reusable boxes. Over the course of the evening the group of 20 riders will meet at a given location with their bicycles and then visit each host at their homes according to the route set by Jen to sample each bite as in the fashion of a progressive dinner. 

Lorien and her young family moved to the house on the corner of Winona and Chelsea in July of 2002. She explains how she absolutely loved the neighborhood and the "cottagey" feel of the house. "It's where I watched my daughter grow from an infant to a young woman and it's the house I brought my, now 9 year old, son home from Highland Hospital to so it's got some serious memories attached" she says. However, before she knew it, Lorien's young family grew beyond

the capacity of the house but she "just couldn't imagine leaving the neighborhood". Lorien worried about moving her kids out of the West Irondequoit School District as they were thriving in program. So, when the house across the street (and three doors down) went on the market she made an appointment to see it. Thrilled with her purchase, Lorien notes that "The kids don't have to switch schools, I have all of the same wonderful neighbors with a slightly different view, and we get to welcome a new family to the neighborhood".

Just as excited about their move, a new young couple has already settled into Lorien's former cottage like home ready to raise a young family much like Lorien did some 12 years ago. As a matter of fact, the gem of a little cottage even sold within 48 hours of being listed.


