Greenlight Networks:

At our last meeting Mark Murphy, the president of Greenlight Networks visited to discuss the build out of high speed, low cost fiber optic internet service in our area. The speeds of Greenlight average out to be much faster than those of Time Warner but for about the same or less cost. Greenlight decides in which neighborhoods to build based on resident interest. Street Trees:

Residents of Winona Woods have demonstrated a lot of interest in our street trees. After all, they are why we call Winona Woods, Winona Woods. We have been working to look into the procedure and rational of the town when replanting these trees. In the process this is what we have learned:

- The town is currently in year 2 of a 3 year street tree grant
- This grant provides 20-25 trees for the entire town each year.
- During each of the 3 years that the town has the grant it focuses on one area.
- Last year the focus was SW Irondequoit so our time has come and gone.
- The town does consider replacement outside focus areas when a removal occurs
- Residents may purchase and plant their own street trees but must get a permit



However, if you would be willing to purchase a street tree (about \$50.00) Winona Woods will be more than willing to secure the permit on your behalf as well as plant the tree for you. *Please e-mail winonawoodsna@gmail.com to register.*

We will continue to work with the town in order to address the concerns of residents and will advise as more information becomes available.

Our Neighborhood Watch Committee Chair, Mike Ratigan hosted a training meeting for residents who were interested in helping to patrol. The meeting took place on April 22nd at 7PM at the St. Paul Boulevard Fire Station. We have included window decals as a separate attachment to this e-mail which you may use to announce the program to criminals by placing in a visible location. Since the meeting we have been working to fill Watcher and Walker roles for this initiative. Role descriptions are included below.

Watcher Guidelines

- Attend or schedule to attend a Neighborhood Watch Training session.
- Join the Winona Watch bulletin e-mail list.
- Keep incident report forms handy at home.
- Pay special attention to things that seem out of the ordinary while on walks, bike rides, or driving through the neighborhood.
- Be proactive, call in any suspicious activity to 911.
- Report any incident to winonawoodswatch@gmail.com after calling 911.

Walker Guidelines:

- Sign up to patrol a beat of your choice and length at least once a month and look for things that seem out of the ordinary.
- Attend or schedule to attend a Neighborhood Watch Training session.
- Join the Winona Watch bulletin e-mail list.
- Keep incident report forms handy at home and on patrol.
- Be proactive, call in any suspicious activity to 911 while at home or on patrol.
- Report any incident to winonawoodswatch@gmail.com after calling 911.
