
Welcome to Irondequoit.

Town Service	Information
Ambulance and Other Emergency Services911	To request police assistance for emergency or non-emergency needs, dial 911. Officers are dispatched only by calling 911.
Animal Services	Animal emergencies: 911
Dogs	Households may have a maximum of two dogs. Dogs must be leashed, in a vehicle, or in an enclosure when off the dog owner's property. Dogs, leashed or unleashed, are not permitted on Town playing fields, parks, or other property. (Please be a good neighbor and pick up your dog's waste.)

	All dogs older than four months must be licensed through the Town Clerk, 336-6047.
Board	The Supervisor and Town Board have regular business meetings normally at 7 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month in the Broderick Room at Town Hall.
	Agendas for Board meetings generally become available on the Town's website by noon Friday before a meeting.
	Citizens who speak at Town Board meetings are asked to make comments within 3 minutes as a courtesy to others.

Brush Pick-Up	The Town provides free curbside bulk brush collection for branches and trimmings (no leaves, please). Information on schedules and requirements can be found at http://bit.ly/dpwbrush
Budget Information	The Town Board adopts a budget each Fall for the fiscal year starting January 1. Copies of the annual budget are available for citizens to read on the web and in the libraries.
	The Town Board normally holds at least three public hearings before making decisions each Fall on the annual budget and the 5-year capital improvements plan. Citizens may also make comments to the Supervisor and Board by letter, fax, or e-mail at any time in the budget process.
Building Services	Building permits and requests for assistance: 336-6026.
	Building permits are required for sheds, fences, stoops, additions, pools, and hot tubs.
	The Town Department of Community Development enforces the NYS Building and Energy Codes and the Irondequoit Town Code. This department is also responsible for resolving asso- ciated code complaints and citizens' requests for assistance.
Cable Television	Irondequoit Cable Access Television (ICAT) broadcasts on channels 12 and 15 of the Time Warner cable system. Regular meetings of the Town Board are cablecast live, and replayed throughout the month.
Courts	The Town Justice Court is open Monday to Thursday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Fridays 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Court closes at 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays during the seasonal Farmers' Market (generally May through October).
Elections	The Supervisor is elected for a two-year term. Town Board members are elected to four-year terms. Terms of Board members are staggered so that two seats are filled by elections every two years.

Environmental Concerns	Some may view climate change as a remote global problem that is beyond the capacity of local government to solve. In Irondequoit, we believe that actions by local government and its citizens and businesses can make a difference. Irondequoit is the first community in the county to adopt a comprehensive energy and environmental policy, which can be viewed on the Town's website.
Environmental Protection Overlay Districts	The Town's zoning code includes Environmental Protection Overlay Districts, or EPODs, which provide an increased level of oversight for development in fragile environmental areas, including steep slopes, woodlots, flood plains, coastal zones, watercourses, and wetlands. If you live or own property in an Environmental Protection Overlay District, please call 336-6015 or 336-6029 for appropriate assistance and approvals before undertaking any construction or site work.
Farmers' Market	Irondequoit's popular Farmers' Market operates Thursday afternoons from May through October. The Market is located behind Town Hall. Vendors sell fresh produce, fruit, foods, and homemade crafts. Free evening entertainment is provided most market days at the adjacent Performing Arts Gazebo.

Home Improvement Grants	The Town administers home improvement grants funded through the federal Community Development Block Grant program for low-income families. Please call 336-6021 for more information.

Leaves Burning	Open burning of leaves is prohibited.
Pick-Up	The Town does not pick up leaves. Do not rake leaves to the curb, as they could block catch basins and cause flooding. Please call your waster hauler for proper disposal.
<section-header></section-header>	The Irondequoit Public Library has two branches: the Helen McGraw Branch, 2180 East Ridge Road, just east of Culver Road (336-6060); and the Pauline Evans Branch, 45 Cooper Road, just north of Titus Avenue (336-6062). Both branches are open 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday; 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Friday; and, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday.
	It is easy to obtain a library borrower card. Just stop at any branch, present identification with your new address, and in a few minutes you will be eligible to borrow library materials and use all library resources at both of our branches and at every public library in Monroe County. Neighborhood Watch	About 25 Neighborhood Watch groups are active in Irondequoit. If you would like to join or start a Neighborhood Watch group, please call the Police Department's Community Services Unit at 336-6000 x2290.
Noise	The Town's noise ordinance sets limits on noise levels. Permits are available for any person wishing to host a temporary event at which sound levels may exceed acceptable limits. Permits are issued by the Town Clerk: 336-6047.
Parking Front Yard	Parking is not permitted on sidewalks and rights-of-way, or on front and side lawns, except driveways.
Winter	To ensure safe driving, snow removal, and road salting, there is no parking on Town streets from midnight to 9:00 a.m. between November 1 and April 15.

To report a crime, accident, or emergency, or to see an officer for any non-emergency situation, call 911.

One of the ways that the Irondequoit Police Department reinforces its ties to the community is through community policing. Officers work closely with residents to address problems in neighborhoods. They coordinate neighborhood efforts and conduct home security checks. Community policing programs include Citizens Police Academies, and other school programs, and Neighborhood Watch.

Recreational Fires	Outdoor recreational fires are a popular activity in Irondequoit. You must follow town guidelines to ensure safe and legal use of outdoor fireplaces. Please contact the Fire Marshal with any questions: 336-6097.
Schools	East Irondequoit Central School District: 339-1200. West Irondequoit Central School District: 342-5500.
Senior Services	Pinegrove Senior Center: 336-6078. The Senior Center provides nutritious meals on weekdays and a wide variety of activities for seniors. Transportation for non- drivers can also be scheduled, and wheelchairs and other medical devices rented. The <i>Life in Irondequoit</i> program helps seniors live independently in their own homes.
Sewer Service	The Town of Irondequoit provides a free, on-call response to residents who experience sewer backups, unusual odors, or other sewer-related problems. This service includes clearing blockages in sanitary sewer laterals. Please call the Department of Public Works at 336-6090.
Solicitors	Individuals selling products or services door-to-door in Irondequoit must have a solicitor's permit. Ask to see it. If they cannot produce one, please call 911 immediately so they can be apprehended.
Street Lights	To report that a street light is out or other service problem, please call Rochester Gas & Electric: 1-800-743-2110.

Taxes Exemptions	Please check with the Assessor to see if you are eligible for tax exemptions on your home: 336-6054. The deadline to apply for exemptions is March 1.
Town and County Taxes	 Town and County Taxes Bills are mailed the last week in December. Payment (full or first installment) is due February 10 without interest. Bills can be paid in three installments at Town Hall. Due dates for installments are as follows: Feb. 10 — First installment Feb. 28 — Second installment Mar. 31 — Third installment Late notices for unpaid taxes are sent by the Monroe County Treasury by April 10. Last day for payments is May 31, after which payments go directly to the Monroe County Treasury.
School Taxes	 School Taxes Bills are mailed the last week in August. Payments are due by October 1 (full payments). Payments can be made in three installments, as follows: Sept. 15 — First installment (payable at Town Hall) Note: If the first installment is not paid by September 20, the installment option is no longer available. Oct. 15 — Second installment (payable and sent to Monroe County) Nov. 15 — Third installment (payable and sent to Monroe County) Last day to pay school taxes is November 18. (If school taxes are not paid by November 18, the amount due plus interest is added to your next Town and County tax bill.)

Trash Collectors	Private contractors pick up trash and bagged leaves in Irondequoit. A list of licensed waste haulers operating in the Town can be found at http://bit.ly/wastehaulers
Cans	Trash cans must have a cover and should be put at the curb only after 4:00 p.m. on the day before pickup. Empty con- tainers must be returned and stored behind the front founda- tion line of the primary structure or within an enclosed build- ing by the end of the service day.
